After completing all parts of this form, including signing and dating it, send back only the first sheet (pages 1 and 2) for filing.

NOTE:**MULTIPLE FILING UNNECESSARY:**

Generally, a person who has filed Form 1 for a calendar or fiscal year is not required to file a second Form 1 for the same year. However, a candidate who previously filed Form 1 because of another public position must at least file a copy of his or her original Form 1 when qualifying.

WHERE TO FILE:

If you were mailed the form by the Commission on Ethics or a County Supervisor of Elections for your annual disclosure filing, return the form to that location.

Local officers/employees file with the Supervisor of Elections of the county in which they permanently reside. (If you do not permanently reside in Florida, file with the Supervisor of the county where your agency has its headquarters.)

State officers or specified state employees file with the Commission on Ethics, P.O. Drawer 15709, Tallahassee, FL 32317-5709.

Candidates file this form together with their qualifying papers.

To determine what category your position falls under, see the "Who Must File" Instructions on page 3.

WHEN TO FILE:

Initially, each local officer/employee, state officer, and specified state employee must file **within 30 days** of the date of his or her appointment or of the beginning of employment. Appointees who must be confirmed by the Senate must file prior to confirmation, even if that is less than 30 days from the date of their appointment.

Candidates for publicly-elected local office must file at the same time they file their qualifying papers.

Thereafter, local officers/employees, state officers, and specified state employees are required to file by July 1st following each calendar year in which they hold their positions.

Finally, at the end of office or employment, each local officer/employee, state officer, and specified state employee is required to file a final disclosure form (Form 1F) within 60 days of leaving office or employment.

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NOTIFICATION OF ASSESSED MAXIMUM FINE FOR FAILURE TO TIMELY FILE FORM 1, STATEMENT OF FINANCIAL INTERESTS

Your Form 1, Statement of Financial Interests, for the year 2001 was due by September 3, 2002, and has not been filed with the office of the Supervisor of Elections for Lee County within 60 days of that date. Section 112.3145(6)(f), Florida Statutes, assesses a fine of \$25.00 per day upon you for each day the disclosure statement was late, up to a maximum fine of \$1,500.00 (60 days late). We are writing to notify you that under this statute you have been fined the amount of \$1,500.00.

This fine must be paid to the Florida Commission on Ethics within 30 days of the date of this notice unless you appeal the fine to the Commission, which has the authority to consider the appeal and waive the fine in whole or in part if the failure to file on time was legally justified.

HOW TO APPEAL:

1. Your appeal must be in writing.
2. Your appeal must be received by the Commission on Ethics within 30 days of the date of this notice (send appeals to the address on this letterhead). PLEASE NOTE: Failure to timely file an appeal will constitute a waiver of the right to appeal.
3. An appeal must be based on "unusual circumstances surrounding the failure to file on the designated due date;" this means "uncommon, rare, or sudden events over which the reporting individual had no control and which directly resulted in the failure to timely file." Circumstances which allowed for time in which to take steps necessary to file on time do not constitute unusual circumstances that will allow waiver of the fine.
4. Your appeal must specifically state the circumstances that led to your not filing by September 3, 2002, and must include any documentation or evidence supporting the appeal, such as:

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LEE COUNTY

- a. Sickness or injury: a statement from attending physician, including dates and severity of the illness or injury;
 - b. Lack of Notification--Wrong Address: a copy of the certified notice or receipt that was returned to the Supervisor of Elections by the U.S. Postal Service;
 - c. Claim of Having Filed: a copy of a certified mail receipt and/or a copy of the completed form which was filed;
 - d. Lack of Notification--Absence from Home during Notification Period: any documentation reflecting the period of time of your absence.
5. You have a right to a hearing before the Commission on your appeal, but if you desire a hearing, you must specifically request one in your notice of appeal. If you do not request a hearing in your appeal, you will waive your right to a hearing and the Commission's determination will be based upon the written record.
6. If you have not already done so, you should file disclosure for the year 2001 prior to or as a part of your appeal, unless you are contesting your obligation to file. If you do file your Form 1 for the year 2001, please provide with your appeal a copy of the filed form showing the Supervisor's date-received stamp. All forms are available at our website, www.ethics.state.fl.us.

Appeals are governed by the provisions of Section 112.3145(6)(f), Florida Statutes, and Commission Rule 34-8.215, Florida Administrative Code.

IF YOU DO NOT PAY OR APPEAL WITHIN 30 DAYS:

If you do not timely file an appeal and do not pay the assessed fine within 30 days, the Commission will take the steps provided by law to collect the fine, including submitting the fine to the Department of Banking and Finance for collection by a collection agent.

Please note that this fine does not limit the civil penalty that may be imposed if your disclosure statement is filed more than 60 days after the deadline and a complaint is filed against you under Section 112.324, Florida Statutes.
