WHAT TO FILE:

After completing all parts of this form, including signing and dating it, send back only the first sheet (pages 1 and 2) for filing.

NOTE:
MULTIPLE FILING UNNECESSARY:

Generally, a person who has filed Form 1 for a calendar or fiscal year is not required to file a second Form 1 for the same year. However, a candidate who previously filed Form 1 because of another public position must at least file a copy of his or her original Form 1 when qualifying.

WHERE TO FILE:

If you were mailed the form by the Commission on Ethics or a County Supervisor of Elections for your annual disclosure filing, return the form to that location.

WHEN TO FILE:

Initially, each local officer/employee, state officer, and specified state employee must file **within 30 days** of the date of his or her appointment

or of the beginning of employment. Appointees who must be confirmed by the Senate must file prior to confirmation, even if that is less than 30 days from the date of their appointment.

Candidates for publicly-elected local office must file at the same time they file their qualifying papers.

Thereafter, local officers/employees, state officers, and specified state employees are required to file by July 1st following each calendar year in which they hold their positions.

Finally, at the end of office or employment, each local officer/employee, state officer, and specified state employee is required to file a final disclosure form (Form 1F) within 60 days of leaving office or employment. However, filing a CE Form 1F (Final Statement of Financial Interests) does not relieve the filer of filing a CE Form 1 if he or she was in their position on December 31, 2013.

**URGENT REMINDER!
YOU MUST ACT NOW!**

Earlier this year, you were notified of your obligation to file a CE Form 1, Statement of Financial Interests, for the year ending December 31, 2013. The grace period for filing this form will expire on September 2, 2014 at 5 p.m., and according to our records, you still have not filed your CE Form 1.

Pursuant to State law, an automatic fine of \$25 per day for each day late (up to a maximum fine of \$1,500) will be assessed against you if your CE Form 1 is not received by September 2, 2014. Please file your CE Form 1 immediately with your county Supervisor of Elections!

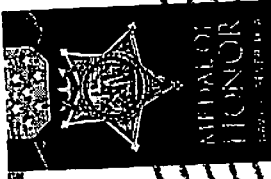
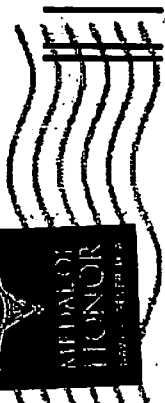
